Girls Varsity Track had many bright performances during the spring, including qualifying for The Penn Relays 4 x 800 "Small Schools Division" for the first time in team history. Caitlin Jorgensen, Lauren Weil, Casey Kinniry, and Jess Miller ran a season's best 9:45! Jorgensen, Weil, Jill McEntee, and Devon Whitaker won the DELCO Relays 4 x 8 earlier in the season in order to get into the race. In terms of the Inter-Ac, even though the team ultimately finished midtable, we had a champion - Kat Harrar - who jumped over 34'! Katie Brian continued her progression in the PV by tying the school record. Cami Beaulieu took 3rd at the Inter-Ac Finals and won her prelim heat at PAISAA in the 110H. There were many more outstanding individual and relay results throughout the spring, too many to recount here. This year's track team enjoyed a very successful season! At the Penn Relays, the 4x400m team of Jack Bush, Malcolm Folk, Sam Wilson, and Chris Zimmerman won the Inter-Ac heat and qualified for the Philadelphia-Area Championship. In doing so, they broke the school's 4x400m record! Another one of the season's biggest highlights came at the Delaware County Championship meet. The boys took home the title in the American (small schools) Division for the second year in a row! In an extremely competitive meet, the team finished 4th at the Inter-Ac championship, ahead of Malvern Prep and Springside-Chestnut Hill, but just two points behind

third place. Chris Zimmerman won the 400m and our 4x400m relay team won gold while breaking the Inter-Ac meet record. We had several school records broken this year: 100m (Jack Bush), twice with the 200m (Chris Zimmerman and Jack Bush), 400m (Chris Zimmerman), twice with the 4x400m Relay (Jack Bush, Malcolm Folk, Sam Wilson, and Chris Zimmerman) & (Sam Wilson, CJ Jones, Jack Bush, and Chris Zimmerman) and Peter Lim tied a 47-year-old Pole Vault record (13'6"). Additionally, CJ Jones qualified for the freshman 400m and will compete at the New Balance Outdoor Nationals in June in Greensboro, NC. The coaches want to thank all of the seniors for a great season and especially our captains, Jack Bush and Chris Zimmerman, for their tremendous leadership!

The girls' varsity softball team went 15-6 (6-4 in the Inter-Ac). As a team, the girls had 156 hits: 115 singles, 31 doubles, 6 triples and 4 homeruns. They had 69 stolen bases, 131 runs and 87 RBIs. The team had a combined batting average of .286, with a on base percentage of 35.5% and a slugging percent of 35.7% This dynamic team earned some respect in the league, finishing second behind the tough Penn Charter team. Our team will miss our four prominent seniors next year. Our co-captains, Grace Smith will head off to UVA and Kaila Lingo to Cornell University. Marley Buckley will head to Drexel University and Maddie Loughead is off to play soccer at University of Richmond. Best of luck to our graduating seniors with all of their future endeavors.

The EA Girls' Lacrosse team slogan for the 2019 season was "ALL IN." This motto helped motivate the team's every action on and off the field, resulting in a remarkably successful season.

The program boasted top 20 national rankings throughout the spring (Inside Lacrosse, US Lacrosse Magazine) and still holds the #1 spot in PA (phillylacrosse.com).

Following an 18-game win streak, EA took home the Inter-Ac Girls' Lacrosse Championship title for the third consecutive year and for the 20th time in program history. In addition to winning the league outright, the program saw a tremendous amount of individual success as well: six players were named All Inter-Ac, one of whom was selected as the league's MVP; three were named USL All-American; three named USL All-Academic; and multiple players hit major statistical milestones and broke team records.

The team's phenomenal success was a result of the outstanding leadership demonstrated by seniors Izzy Rohr (Penn), Olivia Dirks (Penn State), Lindsay Walling (William & Mary), Annie Rau (Denison) and Scottie Crockett (Boston College). This incredibly strong and talented group graduate after four years in the varsity program with 44-4 Inter-Ac record. While we will sorely miss our 2019 senior class, their impact will be felt for many years to come.
